



Towards a Balanced Fleet: Options for a 21st Century Navy

It is principally an historical study that attempts to draw a parallel between todays strategic environment and past environments. The historical analysis focuses on past maritime strategies produced by the U. S. Navy and an historical review of the Royal Navy of the late 19th Century. Through this analysis, broad strategic themes become apparent. Recognizing and understanding these strategic themes illuminates options available to the U. S. Navy. The first historical analysis centers on the development of U. S. maritime strategy since 1970. After almost forty years of maritime history, its stability and coherence remain remarkable. U. S. Navy missions over the forty years focused on four mission areas: sea control, power projection, naval presence, and strategic deterrence. Despite dramatic changes in the strategic environment, what changed in the strategies was the priority placed on specific missions. The strategic concept of the Navys most recent maritime strategy departs from past examples. A Cooperative Strategy for 21st Century Seapower adds two additional missions: maritime security and humanitarian assistance/disaster response. This is a dramatic change, but it...
